

Prof Daya Reddy

Daya Reddy completed bachelor's and doctoral degrees in engineering at the Universities of Cape Town and Cambridge. He currently holds the South African Research Chair in Computational Mechanics at the University of Cape Town. He was a founder member in 2003 of AIMS, the African Institute for Mathematical Sciences, which is now a pan-African network with centers in six African countries. He is actively involved in bodies that work towards strengthening the scientific enterprise and at the science-policy interface and is currently President of the International Science Council, the largest representative non-governmental scientific organization globally.

Daya Reddy is a recipient of the Award for Research Distinction of the South African Mathematical Society, the Order of Mapungubwe, awarded by the President of South Africa for distinguished contributions to science, and of the Georg Forster Research Award from the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation in Germany.
